The governing board of the Lower Colorado River Authority on Wednesday tapped Texas Department of Transportation executive director Phil Wilson as its next general manager.

Wilson's hiring follows the resignation of LCRA general manager Becky Motal, 63, who announced in September she planned to retire after two years as the agency's chief. Her resignation is effective Dec. 31.

Wilson, a former deputy chief of staff for Gov. Rick Perry, was named Texas secretary of state in 2007. He left that job in 2008 to work as a lobbyist and senior vice president at Luminant Energy. He left there to join TxDOT.

LCRA board chairman Tim Timmerman said Wilson's experience as secretary of state, as executive director of TxDOT and as an executive with Luminant Energy made him the best choice.

"He's been in the public sector, been in the private sector, and we're sort of in the middle" as both a water and electricity wholesaler and the manager of parks and the region's main water supply, Timmerman said. "It seemed like a perfect fit."

Timmerman said the LCRA board hired an executive search firm that whittled more than 100 candidates down to three, and they met with the board yesterday. Timmerman declined to say who the other two finalists were; an American-Statesman open-records request for the names is pending.

Timmerman said Perry did not put his thumb on the scale in favor of a particular candidate, though he notes that with the experience Perry has with Wilson, the governor "obviously has a lot of faith in him.

Perhaps more than anything, Timmerman said, Wilson has bona fides working through difficult situations, if which the LCRA has plenty: electric customers suing the organization; tight finances as a result; a persistent drought that has forced Solomon-like choices about how much water Central Texas and downstream agriculture interests should get.

"Our new general manager is obviously going to have to step in and guide us through some tough issues," Timmerman said.


